Position & Responsibilities

Role Summary

Tubman's *Voices in Prevention* program leads classroom presentations in middle and high schools, teaching a curriculum about healthy relationships and violence prevention. The Violence Prevention Educator Intern supports this program, facilitating violence prevention informational sessions to youth.

Impact & Benefits

- Provide youth with the information needed to recognize healthy relationship dynamics
- Support youth as they learn skills to engage in positive conflict resolution within their relationships and interactions with peers
- Educate community youth about the services Tubman has to offer

Position Responsibilities

- Promote well-being of youth by administering prevention-based services
- Provide on-going support through education, individual meetings and support groups
- Awareness of problems facing youth, and ability to problem solve and serve the community

- Excellent communication skills, flexibility, maturity, and positive attitude
- Must have current driver's license, insurance, access to a car, and willingness to travel
- Interest in public speaking, community outreach and youth programs
- Ability to work independently and to manage resources and time effectively
- Ability to work with diverse teams and clients to foster a culturally inclusive environment

- Minimum of 10 hours per week, weekday availability required, September through May
